## ACLS HUMANITIES E-BOOK

ACLS Humanities E-Book (HEB) is the most comprehensive humanities list available online with cost-efficient access. It is a collaboration among 31 learned societies, over 100 publishers, and the University of Michigan's Michigan Publishing division. The result is an online, fully searchable collection of enduring, high-quality books in the humanities, reviewed and recommended by scholars, including prizewinners in their fields. HEB features unlimited, multi-user access and free, downloadable MARC records and stats. It is available on and off-campus through standard web browsers. ## HEB TITLES

HEB currently offers nearly 4,700 titles selected by scholars across the humanities, with hundreds of new titles added each year. The collection includes monographs, critical studies, annotated primary sources, and essays — both in print and out-of-print — ranging from the 1880s through the present. Titles link to publishers' websites and to online reviews in the major journals in JSTOR, Project MUSE and other sites. HEB offers full cross-searchability. ## SEARCH, BROWSE & VIEW

Search options include simple, Boolean, proximity and bibliographic; plus full-text, author, title, subject, publisher or special series. Search histories are included. Users may browse by title, author or subject. Browsing by subject provides a full listing of Library of Congress subjects drawn dynamically from the HEB collection's MARC records, provided free. Viewing options include page-image, text and PDF.
