ACLS Humanities E-Book (HEB) is the most comprehensive humanities list available online with cost-efficient access. It is a collaboration among 31 learned societies, 125 publishers, and the University of Michigan's Michigan Publishing division. The result is an online, fully searchable collection of enduring, high-quality books in the humanities, reviewed and recommended by scholars, including prizewinners in their fields. HEB features **unlimited, multi-user access** and free, downloadable MARC records and stats. It is available on and off-campus through standard web browsers. THE COLLECTION

HEB currently offers 5,153 titles selected by scholars across the humanities, with hundreds of new titles added each year. The collection includes monographs, critical studies, annotated primary sources, and essays — both in print and out-of-print — ranging from the 1880s through the present. Titles link to publishers' websites and to online reviews in the major journals in JSTOR and Project MUSE. HEB offers full cross-searchability.

Many of our top-hit titles include books frequently acquired in print by academic librarians for use by faculty and students. Online access to the HEB collection for the entire university community eliminates the need to add copies of in-demand titles to a library's holdings and having to purchase replacement copies for print books that are lost or damaged, saving thousands of dollars for your institution.
